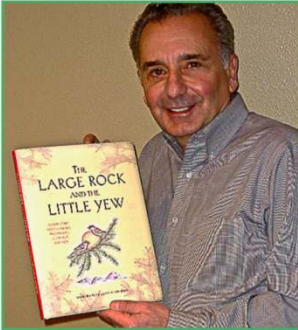




DOING GOOD IN OUR COMMUNITY UPDATE:
 Author Greg Ahlijian and Jasper Mountain Center



Several years ago we started following Greg Ahlijian and his beautiful book, "The Large Rock and the Little Yew," which was written to provide comfort and encouragement for children living in

difficult circumstances. Greg was inspired to write the book from his time spent volunteering at the Jasper Mountain Center and committed to donating all of the money from the sales of the book for the building of an outdoor multi-use recreation facility on site. Jasper Mountain Center is a non-profit organization which provides a continuum of programs that meet the needs of emotionally disturbed children and their families.

We are happy to announce, "The Large Rock and the Little Yew" has now raised over \$106,000, with a goal of reaching \$110,000 for the Jasper Mountain courtyard project. The Children's Outdoor Recreation Facility has been designed and a permit application has been submitted to the County. Ground breaking will begin upon permit approval.

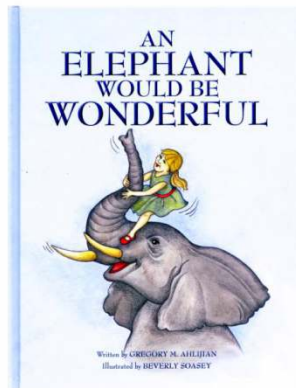

YARD DEBRIS RECYCLING

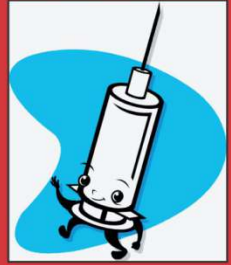
IF IT GROWS IT GOES

Place in your grey yard debris cart anything that grows above the ground in your yard.

Grass, leaves, branches up to 4" in diameter, brush, fruit tree discards and plant vegetation

- Close the lid
- 120 pound limit
- **No** dirt or rocks
- **No** bags
- **No** pet waste
- **No** poison oak

Sharps **NEVER** belong in your recycling or garbage carts!

COMMINGLE RECYCLE INSTRUCTIONS:

All Recycling Must Be **CLEAN!**

INCLUDE ONLY THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

- **Flat Cardboard**
- **Paper** - mail, newspaper, magazines, phone books, paper bags, wrapping paper, computer paper, colored paper
- **SHREDDED PAPER** - must be contained in a paper bag with the top rolled closed
- **Plastic** - jugs, tubs & bottles only - **NO LIDS**
- **Metal** - food and beverage cans (**NO UNATTACHED LIDS**) & clean aluminum foil crumpled into a ball no smaller than a fist



Haul-i-days

If your pick up day falls on or following one of these holidays, your pick up will be one day later ending with Friday's pick up being done on Saturday.

New Years Day
Memorial Day
4th July
Labor Day
Thanksgiving Day
Christmas Day

Example: Thanksgiving Day only affects Thursday & Friday customers
